Mark 1:4-11 - Steve Green

⁴And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷And this was his message: "After me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

¹While Apollos was at Corinth, Paul took the road through the interior and arrived at Ephesus. There he found some disciples ²and asked them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?"

They answered, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit."

₃So Paul asked, "Then what baptism did you receive?" "John's baptism," they replied.

⁴Paul said, "John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the one coming after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. ⁷There were about twelve men in all.

<u>Sermon – Sam</u> Baptism in/of the Holy Spirit ~ Spirit filled life

I want to say from the outset, that if in this moment in time you find yourself, because of the situation we have been in in the last year, and now find ourselves in again this year in regards to Covid-19 and lockdown restrictions, feeling rather 'spiritually malnourished'; that is, feeling dry and ineffective, feeling defeated, and maybe you are in a place where you want or are yearning for the spirit to fill your lips and lives with a new lease of life, this message is especially for you.

Last week, Jonathan talked about the abundance of riches God has mercifully given us as His children, riches that we are either not putting to good use, or worse still completely unaware we even have them. And one of these riches is the 'Baptism of the Holy Spirit (hereafter BIS), which is one of the most thrilling aspects of the Spirits work in our lives. The phrase 'Baptism of the Holy Spirit' is found a number of times in the New Testament only, and two of those times are in today's Bible readings. In the Mark reading, we find John the Baptist proclaiming that He who he prepares the way for, is the one who 'Baptises with the Holy Spirit' (v8)... and in the second reading, we find the Apostle Paul almost sounding shocked that the disciples he had come across had not received the 'Baptism of the Holy Spirit.' These disciples believed in Jesus as the messiah but they hadn't really understood the significance of His death and resurrection or the work of the Holy Spirit. And it's fair to say, they were incomplete as Christians. Which is why Paul lays hand on them in prayer and they receive the BIS.

And I think just like the disciples Paul came across, many of us, Christians, believers, have tragically failed to understand, expect, believe, and experience all that the relationship with God in Christ has afforded us. And I hope this message goes a long way in helping us understand this gift of the BIS, and to seek to live a spirit filled life in this season when many will feel spiritually empty.

The first and probably the most important thing to say is that, every Christian, every believer has the gift of the BIS. 1 Corinthians 12.13 says "The BIS is available for all who repent and believe and are baptised into Christ" (paraphrased). Paul plainly puts it that All have received this Baptism without exception. All who confess that Jesus is Lord, have received it. It's not the special privilege of the few, it's the birth right of all believers. There is a lot of debate in the theological world on when or how one receives the BIS or what evidences (outwardly) they have to show if they have it, and so on and so forth. But personally, I believe this does not matter and has unfortunately led to a lot of confusion in this area. Baptism of the Holy Spirit is received by simple faith in Christ, which then

positions us in Christ, cementing ALL believers securely into the Family of God. Charles Stanley, one of the few American preachers I listen to says this of BIS, "If you have trusted Christ as your saviour, you have the Baptism of the Spirit. Not only that, you have been indwelt, filled, and therefore have everything you need to experience the wonderful spirit life."

The second thing to note then is, what is Baptism in/of the Holy Spirit? James Dunn in his book 'Baptism in the Spirit,' describes it as "the gift of saving grace by which one enters into Christian experience and life – into the new covenant, into the Church." He goes on to say, "It is, in that last analysis, that which makes a man and a woman a Christian. Simply put, it's that which joins the believer to the Church (The Body of Christ) and equipping him or her for life and ministry.

When we have accepted Christ as Lord and Saviour, and therefore Baptised in the Spirit, we are therefore given a new identity in Christ, a new relationship with God, power and gifting for ministry are readily released. BIS in scripture is often accompanied with words like, the spirits promising, clothing, empowering, pouring, receiving, filling, gifting... and so on.

Fire Place



To help us understand this further, I want to use the analogy of a fire place. And I want us to think more about an indoor fire place, which if fortunate to have, like we do in our household, has been put to good use this very cold winter.

We all light our fire places differently, the important thing is that they light ~ which is

true for the Baptism of the Spirit, for some it may come suddenly like a violent wind, for others it's gradual, it can also manifest its self with a sense of love, or peace, or power, or joy ~ or it may come with deep sense of assurance. Simon Ponsonby says, "What matters is not so much the exact what, or the when, but the whether." He goes on to say, "We are all uniquely made and the spirit always fits himself to us, who we are, where we are, how we are – but he never leaves us as we are."

To keep the fire crackling in the fire place, one has got to constantly throw in more wood to keep it going. similar analogy with BIS, we have established that we now have it burning in us, but to sustain, strengthen and keep the fire of the BIS burning brightly in us, we have got to keep throwing in Prayer, bible study, fellowship, laying on of hands (when it's allowed again), spiritual disciplines, fasting, giving, the sacraments, service... and so on, if we are to live a spirit filled life.

And when a fire is burning brightly, all those close to it are able to feel its warmth ~ when the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is stirred up in us, it's not just for our won spiritual lives, but it's also for the service of others (ministry).

Conclusion

Preparing this message, I was really encouraged and my spirit lifted with the somewhat new knowledge I gained on the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, and I hope this message has the same impact on you as you read this. If like me you are seeking for a closer sense of God's presence in your life, a deeper love for Him, a spirit filled life that is revitalised, ushering in a new lease of life, bringing maybe never before known gifts, then the challenge for us going forward is seeking, praying and pursuing God for more of the Spirit.

It's very easy as a Christian to settle, to be comfortable, but my encouragement is let us not do that, let us press on into Christ daily, constantly that we might be a people of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, living to the fullest, a wonderful spirit filled life.

Please pray this prayer with me and take at least two minutes in silence after waiting on the filling/refilling of the spirit

Dear Lord, thank you for the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, I pray that you will create a hunger, a thirst in for more of your Spirit.... come Holy Spirit, fill me anew and help me live a life that's worthy of your praise and for your Glory. Amen
