John 1:1-14 - Pauline Wilde, St Peter's

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2He was with God in the beginning. 3Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4In him was life, and that life was the light of men. 5The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

⁶There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. ⁸He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

₉The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world. ₁₀He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ₁₁He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ₁₂Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God-- ₁₃children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

₁₅He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ₁₆For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. ₁₇He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. ¹⁹For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, ²⁰and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

<u>Sermon – Mick Moorse</u> – **Because you're worth it.**

The first chapter of John's Gospel is his account of the birth of Jesus. We notice that it is very different from Matthew's and Luke's. John doesn't take us back 2000 years to Bethlehem NO he takes us back billions of years to the creation of the universe. He writes in the beginning immediately we are reminded of the first words of the Bible "in the beginning God" we have an account of creation. But John says "in the beginning was the word" he goes on "and the Word was with God and the Word was God". In v14 it says "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us". So John identifies the baby in the manger, it is God the creator of the universe, v3 "All things were made through Him and without Him was not any thing made that was made". The Colossians reading says "For by Him all things were created in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions, or rulers or authorities". The Word/Jesus/the baby in the manger was the agent of all creation and it was including human beings created good. The planet earth was the perfect planet, the whole universe in fact and life was good. The crown of creation was us, humankind. Genesis 1:27 – 'So God created humankind in His image'. That included free-will, which could be used for the good of others or selfishly for self. Unfortunately, it was used selfishly. And the whole earth became no longer good, it was contaminated. The Bible calls the contamination 'sin'. And the sad thing about sin is that it causes separation, Isaiah 59:2 – 'but your impurities (sins) have made a separation between you and your God'. A barrier has been placed between the creator and the created. It wasn't meant to be like this. God and humans were meant to be one, in fellowship with each other, illustrated by the picture we are given in Genesis 3:8 of God waiting in the garden in the cool of the day to be with the humans. But sin had created a barrier. Could the barrier be removed, and fellowship restored? Could people live perfect lives and so have fellowship with God? No, we are not perfect no matter how hard we try – we know it – The sin problem had to be dealt with in another way. So, Jesus – the Word – creator of the universe, the baby in the manger came. As Graham

Kendrick in his hymn says, "The one who strode among the stars and called each one by name lies helpless in a mother's arms and must learn to walk again". He came as a baby, He grew up; lived a sinless perfect life, became a carpenter, and when He was about 30 left the security of home and became a travelling teacher, preacher, and leader. Because He was outspoken, He made enemies, particularly the religious leaders who plotted to have Him killed. Although He was innocent of any crime, He was convicted, condemned, and executed by crucifixion. A painful and cruel way to die. So by His death, although we may not understand it, the sin barrier can be removed by each individual and for that person fellowship with God restored. But why did the creator of the universe, the cosmic Christ, if you like, step down and become a tiny vulnerable human baby, and then an itinerant, preacher, teacher, and finally die like a criminal on a cross. "though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped at but made Himself nothing, taking the form of a servant . . . and being found in Human form humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" Why is the restoration of fellowship so important? Why did the cosmic Christ step down become the human Jesus and die on a cross? Why? Why? Because in God's eyes YOU ARE WORTH IT. So He says come and follow me.

I want to finish with a story, it's not a true story but deals with a truth.

There was once a boy whose hobby was model making. Among the models he made was a sailing boat. It was a very good model and when he had finished it he was very proud of it. It looked magnificent. But he wondered if it would float. So he took it to the local park which had a boating pool; where he launched his boat. It floated beautifully. Then he wondered – would it sail on the sea. There was only one way to find out. He lived in a seaside town, so he waited until the sea was calm, then he launched his boat. It sailed beautifully, which pleased him no end. So he watched it bobbing up and down, riding the small waves with ease. He watched it proudly. Then he noticed it was out of his reach. The tide had turned and the boat was carried out to sea. Soon he lost sight of it altogether. Did this mean that the boat was lost to him. The tide would turn, perhaps the boat would be washed up. So he checked the tides and made sure he was on the beach at each high tide. He did this for weeks, but no boat, so he gave up. Then one day as he was passing a shop which sold antiques and collectables, he saw his boat in the window, he looked twice, yes it was his boat alright. So he went in and told his story to the

shopkeeper. Who was sympathetic but insisted that if he wanted the boat he would have to pay for it. He rushed home to get the money and paid for the boat and said – "Now you are doubly mine. I made you, and now I've bought you". That's just what Jesus says to us – "I made you, I have bought you (redeemed you) you are doubly mine.

We may be all sorts but Jesus did it ALL FOR YOU! So what are you going to do?
