DRIVERS – BE AWARE! The automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) camera that monitors vehicle access to High Street, by Woking Station, is in operation.

Since an experimental traffic regulation order along High Street was formally introduced in August 2017, vehicle access has been restricted to buses and authorised vehicles only between the hours of 7am and 9pm.

Unauthorised vehicles entering the area during the restricted hours will be issued a Fixed Penalty Notice.
