## **REV BEV'S REFLECTION**

God is with us Job 38 reminds us that God is right there beside us in our suffering and he speaks to us in our doubts and questions. Job was an upright man of God, but when he lost everything, he didn't understand why it happened. God heard his questions and spoke to him asking, 'Who is this that darkens my counsel with words without knowledge?' Job's obedience to God didn't shield him from suffering and his words were without knowledge of God. Can any of us really truly comprehend the awesome nature of God? I quess not.

God's speech reminds us that he not only hears our questions, he looks to our hearts and to our trust and faith in him. So it is in faith that God calls us to leave our nets of security, set our sails for the distant shores and cross over to the other side, taking the gospel of Christ to those in need. This is the challenge facing each of us in our communities today – to tear down our walls and barriers, and answer the call to reveal Christ in the humanitarian love and unity of his people. It is the starting point for our Community Audit and for all that we do as a Church in mission. Rev Bev.
