

MICK'S MUSINGS

As I write, there are two words that I hear frequently on the News. They are 'disappointment' and 'devastation'. England, for whom there were high hopes, are out of the World Cup. Disappointment is not something new, and it is not only caused by failure at the World Cup. Disappointment is a fact of life and is a very common emotion.

Some early followers of Jesus, after the crucifixion, expressed their disappointment in these words: "We had hoped that He was the one to redeem Israel". But their hopes had been dashed. As far as they were concerned Jesus was dead. But Jesus was here with them. Jesus came to them to help in their disappointment. As we go through life we are going to feel disappointed and, at times, devastated, not because of failure at a game, but real disappointment and at times devastation and Jesus will comenear and metaphorically walk with us and help us. The Bible tells me, so does personal experience.
