

REV BEV'S REFLECTION

The Transfiguration ... we are changed ...

The synoptic gospels put the Transfiguration of Jesus, celebrated on 6 August, at the high point of Jesus' ministry. It follows on from Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ of God, and it is from this point onwards that Jesus' journey to the Passover in Jerusalem begins. So what happened at the transfiguration? We know the story well. Jesus' face changes, his clothes become bright, and two men, Elijah (the Prophet) and Moses (the Law), in glorious splendour are talking to him.

In this story, the beauty and light of God is glimpsed by the disciples and a change takes place. It is not a change in Jesus. He is transfigured, not by becoming what he is not, but by manifesting who he is to Peter, John and James, the three disciples present. Jesus opens their eyes, gives them sight, and shows them the glory of God. In this regard, it is the disciples who are changed by what they see, which strengthens them for the journey ahead.

I pray that God open our eyes, the eyes of our hearts, so that we may see him with a deep faith, and stand firm amidst the challenges of this world.
