

VICAR'S VIEW

Thinking about all those in need at Christmas I was reflecting this week that while it is relatively easy to love and have compassion for our family and close friends in need, it is much harder to do so for someone we don't know or a distant group of people in need. Our human nature only has the capacity for actively loving and caring for a relatively small number of people, in particular those we know well or have close attachment to. The Bible tells us that God loved the whole world so much that he sent his son Jesus to be one of us and ultimately to die for us. That's love and compassion for 100 billion people (the estimate of humans who have ever lived) which tells me two amazing things about God:

- Firstly, he has the capacity to love that many people, such is his unfathomable areatness.
- Secondly, he knows each one of these 100 billion, including you and me, intimately. In fact he knew us before we were born and out of that love and compassion for us chose to humble and limit himself to become Emmanuel – God with us, to provide a way for us to be reconciled to Him.

What an amazing God we worship this Christmas!
