Anyone entitled to attend the APCM may raise any question of parish or general church interest. Notices about the preparation of the New Electoral Roll will be displayed at all three churches – the closing date is <u>8th April</u>.

Even if you have been a church member for many years, please do not forget to fill in an application form, sign it and pass it to one of the churchwardens or directly to me so that you can be added to the new Electoral Roll. You need to be baptised and aged 16 or over and either resident in the parish or, if not resident, you need to have attended public worship regularly at one of our churches in the last six months.

I look forward to receiving plenty of forms by the closing date, but you don't need to wait until then! – Brigitte Morton, Electoral Roll Officer



Our Parochial Church Council met last week and here are some highlights from the meeting:

- Peter Clifford and Jenny Jones were approved to train to be Occasional Preachers. Their course starts in May.
- we discussed the issue of children receiving communion before confirmation and will be consulting with parents and congregation members over the next few months about the possibility of introducing it into the parish
- we will be initiating a 'Link' system where everyone in our churches will have someone looking out for them as was implemented in St Mark's some years ago. More details to follow
- we agreed that from now on all Parish United Services, usually on the 5th Sunday of the month, will start at the usual Sunday service time of the church it is held in rather than at the uniform time of 10.00am as they have been. These will always be publicised well in advance.
