

RACHEL'S RAMBLINGS

Trinity Sunday is a little bit special to me – it's the day my youngest daughter was baptised, the day I first preached God's Word from the pulpit and of course the day we celebrate one of the greatest mysteries of our faith, the Trinity.

I've heard many analogies for the Trinity over the years, some of which offer helpful insights, some of which are downright heretical! The one I like best is perichoresis, the divine dance. This pictures the Trinity as three dancers, each individual moving and flowing amongst each other such that you can't tell where one begins and another ends. Father, Son and Holy Spirit each share in the life of the other two in a way we can't comprehend, the ultimate expression of life in community.

The exciting part is that they invite us to join the dance too! "I'll live in you if you'll live in me, I am the Lord of the dance said he."
