

First Sunday after Trinity

Welcome

This Sunday in our 10.00am online service we will be exploring the sad and undoubtedly complex story of Ananias and Sapphira, two of the very first Christians, who tried to deceive others not realising you can't deceive God. Like many of us I have been deeply affected by the #BlackLivesMatter movement that has come to prominence with the tragic and evil killing of George Floyd, which has caused me to read articles by black people to help me understand a little better what it is like to face racism on a regular basis. It is very easy for people like me to say "I am not racist, I have black friends" and deceive ourselves because we never look introspectively at whether unwittingly we sometimes speak or act in ways that are subtly racist.

I expect Ananias and Sapphira thought they were doing good by giving some of the proceeds from the sale of their field to God's work, so thought that negated their deception of giving the impression to the apostles that they had given the whole of the proceeds.

The introduction to Evening Prayer from the Book of Common Prayer often begins with the words of 1 John 1: 8. "If we say that we have no

sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." Ananias and Sapphira ended up deceived themselves and not the apostles nor God. I hope we don't deceive ourselves whether it be to do with racism, greed or our behaviour during this pandemic, but humbly reflect and ask God to reveal what words or actions hurt others and God, so that we can change our behaviour knowing that "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
