

* ANNUAL MEETINGS *

Due to the latest guidance these meetings in church must be kept short so there will only be a short general open forum. It would be helpful if you have any questions to email or call Jonathan before the meeting who will answer them in his report. Questions will be able to be asked at the APCM.

Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting will be held on Tuesday 20 October at 7.45pm but will now only be via Zoom, not in St Peter's. This is because we are being more strongly encouraged now not to hold them in church and because we are not able to have an open forum for questions in church, whereas we can on Zoom. At the APCM we will be reflecting on 2019 and electing our churchwardens and Deanery Synod representatives. In addition there will be a brief reflection on our current situation and an opportunity to ask questions. For both meetings the Zoom link is the same as the Sunday live services, meeting id 585531880, password 1090 and those without the internet can phone in as for Sunday services.

* PCC HIGHLIGHTS *

The PCC met this week and here are some highlights of the meeting:

- After some requests and following consultation the evening service at St Peter's will start at 5.00pm, instead of 6.30pm, during winter months from 8 November.
- We are excited to announce that Rachel Johnson is going through the process of discernment to be an Ordained Local Minister, continuing to be based in the parish. If she is recommended to be ordained by the Church of England then she will start her two year training in September 2021. The PCC agreed to fund her training and to support her in this new stage of ministry within the parish.
- We agreed to support St Michael's Church, Sheerwater as a Mission Partner in 2021, to the tune of £1000 per annum. St Michael's is a small, but growing Anglican church that is seeking funding and practical support to continue its much needed mission to the Sheerwater estate, following the end of a Church of England grant.

* COVID-19 RULE OF SIX *

This is the new 'Rule of Six', which we thought would be helpful for everyone to know,

In England, the limit of up to six people from multiple households meeting up applies both indoors and outdoors, and to all ages.

When seeing friends and family you do not live with you should:

- 1. meet in groups of six or less
- 2. follow social distancing rules
- 3. limit how many different people you see socially over a short period of time
- 4. meet people outdoors where practical; meeting people outdoors is safer than meeting people indoors because fresh air provides better ventilation.

As well as the above, venues following COVID-19 secure guidelines will be able to continue to host more people in total – such as religious services in places of worship – but no one should mix in a group of greater than six. For more specific information please see www.gov.uk/coronavirus.

- subscribe to the Parish of St Peter Woking *YouTube* channel (click the Subscribe button below the video) to get direct access from *YouTube* without needing to go via the website
- listen via telephone for those without internet access. Just before the service call 0330 0885830, enter the meeting id as 585531880 when prompted then press #, then when asked for a participant id press # again and then when asked for the password enter 1090 followed by #. You will then be able to listen to the service. It is a local call cost which is free for most people.

For those watching live via *YouTube* use the chat facility to talk to one another before, during and after the service. If you can't watch it live, it will be available online afterwards, but not by phone.

* **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - SHOEBOX SUNDAY - 1 NOVEMBER 2020** * In spite of Covid-19 we are again participating this year and our boxes need to be ready by Sunday 1 November.



Details of what can (and cannot) be included in the boxes are given in the leaflets that are now available in the churches, together with flat-pack shoeboxes. Each shoebox needs to be accompanied by a donation of £5 to cover distribution costs etc. If you are unable to fill a shoebox perhaps you could consider

making a financial contribution towards this or the cost of the flat-pack boxes.

Filling your shoebox

Select a quality toy such as a doll, toy truck, deflated football and pump or a cuddly toy. Then pack the box full with other fun toys, hygiene items and school supplies. All items should be new. . <u>New for this year!</u> Hand-made or knitted stuffed toys can be included, providing they are stuffed with commercial stuffing and not, for example, old stockings or beans.

Full details are also available on the OCC website - <u>https://www.samaritans-</u><u>purse.org.uk/what-we-do/operation-christmas-child/</u></u> where you can also find details of how to pack a box online, choosing the gifts that you would like to be included and a video that shows how excited the children are when they receive a box. Each online shoebox costs £20, which includes the £5 for shipping and distribution costs.

Boxes can be brought to St Peter's, to the Shoebox Service or, if you are attending one of the All Souls' Day Memorial Services later in the day, you could leave it in the church then. They can also be brought to the "Energise" service next Sunday if you won't be in church on Sunday 1 November.
