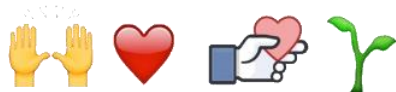

We will remember them

On the 11 November 1918 at 11.00am the guns fell silent on the Western Front to end the First World War, a war to end all wars.

Up and down the country in towns and villages there are memorials to remember those who lost their lives. So on the second Sunday in November we pause to remember not only those who lost their lives in the First World War, but all the wars that have been fought since. At the Acts of remembrance often the names are read out so we don't forget.

In the Bible there are over 260 passages where the word 'remember' or 'remembrance' is mentioned. One passages that stands out to me is in Luke's Gospel where one of the criminals being crucified with Jesus, says to him "Lord remember me when you come into your kingdom" and Jesus replies "Today you will be with me in paradise".
