

## \* VICAR'S VIEW \*

I'm sure most of you are aware that the Church of England's Governing body, General Synod, last month debated and voted on issues regarding human sexuality including same-sex marriage and blessings that followed on from the 'Living in Love and Faith' initiative we engaged with in 2021. It was always going to be a subject with strongly held opinions that was going to divide the church and the bishops did their best in a very difficult situation to present a way forward. In the end General Synod, which is made up of three houses – Bishops, Clergy and Laity – voted in favour of a motion which included providing prayers to bless same-sex couples in church, but would not change the church's doctrine on marriage that is define as being between a man and a woman.

This caused upset to many at both ends of the debate – those who believe that all non–celibate same–sex relationships are unbiblical and those who want the Church of England to allow same–sex marriage services in church. It threatens to divide the Church of England and the Anglican Communion, and the bishops are working hard to find ways of enabling unity. We have differing views here in the parish, but please continue to pray for the Church of England and her bishops and for unity as Christ prayed for unity. It is hard to find neutral discussion on this topic in the media, and the secular media rarely understands the nuances of the debate. You can get detailed reports on the Synod debates and differing views from the Church Times either online at

https://www.churchtimes.co.uk/topics/general-synod or I can lend you a paper copy if you ask. I would like to hold an open forum in due course, probably after Easter, for those who would like to discuss these issues further.

#### \* MALCOLM PRITCHARD - MISSION PARTNER \*

Malcolm's main work at Gulu, Uganda, has continued to be his teaching work of trainee ministers at the theological college there.

In recent months however, he has additionally been running the Alpha course for some 75 inmates at the main Gulu prison, and has enjoyed, together with the



enthusiastic support of the inmates there, a blessing through *Hebrews* 13.3 'Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison'. Bibles distributed to all and gratefully received, and the spine tingling acapella singing of the male voices in confined spaces an encouragement and joy for all. Malcolm comments that a significant proportion of them will be in prison there through false or malicious allegations, and one of the virtues of the Alpha course may be to help stop them looking for revenge on release...!

Malcolm has also been very busy in helping with the departure of the college principal and the provision and arrival of her replacement – lots of administration and other support work. He asks for our prayers for the Revd. Sarah Cawdell, and her husband Simon, as she takes on the role.

In addition, as a local representative of CMS and our Church of England, he has also spent time in conversations with senior Ministry & Clergy in Uganda over the recent voting of the Anglican Church at its General Synod on the doctrine of marriage with regard to same sex couples, with many of the nuances of the debates rather getting lost in translation to the local cultures and languages.

That would be a busy agenda for anyone, and although Malcolm has recovered from his suspected minor stroke some months ago, he has decided nevertheless that it is now the right time for him to leave Uganda fairly soon in the months ahead, although not necessarily to leave from other CMS work. Jonathan will keep us further informed when details become clearer.

I am sure you will all join me in giving thanks in our prayers for Malcolm's time at Gulu and for his good health and further ministry in the future.
