* GOVERNMENT TESTING OF EMERGENCY ALERTS SYSTEM - NEW *

This Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3.00pm, the government will carry out a national test of the Emergency Alerts system. This means most mobile phones and tablets across the UK will receive a test message, accompanied by a loud siren-like sound and vibration that will last for about 10 seconds.

The message you receive will clearly state that this is a test and that no action is required on your part. The alert will come through even if your device is set to silent mode, which is an important feature of the system designed to ensure people receive warnings in genuine emergencies.

* VICAR'S VIEW *

This piece is aptly titled for my reflection this month because as a Vicar some people expect you not just to have a View on big issues in the world, but to make a public stand for them, particularly the ones they feel strongly about. Whether it be concerning Ukraine, Gaza, asylum seekers, LGBTQ+ rights, assisted dying, abortion, climate change etc.

Rachel's sermon last Sunday was very powerful about challenging injustice as Christians, and left us thinking "what can I do"? Personally I feel I can't be active in every area of injustice, there are so many in this fallen world, but that there are issues that are close to me or that I feel most strongly about that I will act upon through letter writing, petitions, financial giving, bringing to the church etc so that I can put all my energy into those.

We don't read about Jesus actively speaking against Roman occupation or slavery etc, but he did take a strong stand against the Jewish leaders leading God's people astray because that was his calling. And he mostly chose to act, rather than speak, against injustice towards the treatment of lepers and women, the poor and the marginalised.

Don't let the scale of injustice in the world paralyse you into doing nothing, but don't feel guilty that you can't do everything. Know your calling, act upon it, pray, and be part of building God's Kingdom of justice together.
